
Arriving by car

1 Arriving from the motorway (A43)

Leave the A43 at exit **"Bochum Querenburg/Ruhr-Universität".** Follow the road *Universitätsstraße* in direction "**Zentrum/Universität"**.

2 Arriving from Bochum city centre

If you come from direction Bochum city centre take the road *Universitätsstraße* (which starts at the train station) in direction **"Ruhr-Universität"**.



Leave the road *Universitätsstraße* at the exit "Ruhr-Universität-Ost / Fachhochschule" and enter the Schattenbachstraße.

Parking possibilities:

(1) Parking area "Uni-Ost / Fachhochschule"

Follow the road Schattenbachstraße a few hundred meters. Please follow the respective parking signs to the big parking area on the left side.

(2) Parking lane directly in front of the main entrance

Follow the road Schattenbachstraße a few hundred meters until the end and turn left on the Lennershofstraße. At the next junction turn **right** and you will see the main entrance of Bochum University of Applied Sciences on your left side. Directly in front of the main entrance you will see the parking lane (disabled parking spots are declared separately).

(3) Visitors' parking area on the campus

After entering the Schattenbachstraße you can follow the signs

Internationales Geothermiezentrum until the

parking area for visitors on the campus. Follow the road "Schattenbachstraße a few hundred meters until the end and turn <u>left</u> on the Lennershofstraße. At the next junction turn again <u>left</u> and after 100 meters you will see a barrier on the right side. Visitors can press the button of the interphone and request access to the campus. On the campus there a few visitor parking spots directly in front of **building G2**, which belongs to our International Geothermal Centre.

Arriving with public transport

The International Geothermal Centre can be reached by **underground line U35** (for example from the main train station) or by **bus line 346**.



1 Arrival with the underground line U 35 (campus line)

- Take the underground **U35** in direction Bochum-Querenburg/Ruhr-Universität/Hustadt until the **station** Lennershof (first stop after Ruhr-Universität).
- Line U35 leaves every 5 minutes (exception: during school holidays it is only every 10 minutes). Journey time from Bochum main train station until station Lennershof is approximately 10 minutes.
- When you reach the upper lift area please go left in the southward direction.
- Follow the road **Im Westenfeld** (one-way road in a residential area) until the end and turn then left.
- At the next junction (parking space access) please go to the right and pass on the left side the Blue Box (glass building) until you reach the **Lennershofstraße**.
- After around 50 m there is a cross-walk on the left side. After passing the cross-walk you are standing directly in front of the main entrance of the University of Applied Sciences. Enter the main entrance and just go straight ahead until the end. At the end you go downstairs and go out of the building. The 3 black buildings, which you can see now on the left side is the International Geothermal Centre (buildings G1, G2 and G3).





2 Arrival with bus line 346

- Take the bus line 346 until the station "Fachhochschule".
- After you exit the bus go right until the end of the parking area.
- From here you can follow the respective signs on the left side.
- Enter the main entrance and just go straight ahead until the end. At the end you go downstairs and go out of the building. The 3 black buildings, which you can see now on the left side is the International Geothermal Centre (buildings G1, G2 and G3).
